Tuesday June 24th 1879
With fresh breezes from the
E. mid part - calm latter part
got a light breeze from the
S. Lat - 32° 45'
Lon 85° 00'

Wednesday 25th

Moderate wind shifted overboard
the head gear and had the
spanker duff on deck and
put another new goose neck

Lat - 33° 00'
Lon 85° 12'

Thursday 26th

Wind hauled into the S.W.
and squally

Friday 27th

Strong breeze and rain
mid part - wind hauled
into the S.W. latter part
fine weather

Saturday 28th

Fine weather breeze
steering S.E. mid & latter
part - rain wind from all
points of the compass

Sunday 29th

With strong baffling winds and
rain mid and latter part -
clear saw the Bark Stamboul
and John & Winthrop

Cruising.

Monday June 30th 1879
With fresh breezes from the
S.E. vessel striking into the
S.W. latter part - spoke
the Bark Stamboul and began
a game again about 10³⁰ o'clock
raised 1st whale going
into the S.E. and lowered
Waist-Boat went on strack
got foul line and cut the
rest - cleared off so ends

Lat - 32° 30'
Lon 83° 30'

Tuesday July 1st 1879

Spicing the wind hauled
into the S.W. about 2³⁰ PM
Waist-Boat went on again
and the whale took the
remains of the line the
whale then came up still
last boat went on strack
and killed him got the
whale to the vessel got
supper and got the watches
latter part - blowing and raining
got fire raised and head
marked and hole cut
so ends

Wednesday 2nd

Moderated took the saw in
and got the head off and
lashed down for the night
latter part fine weather the
Stamboul took the head
and we were in the S.W. and
started the work so ends
