

Off Secorro

Tuesday, Oct 7th 1879
With moderate breezes from the Westward spoke the bark Nautilus & Napoleon, and gave them their letters. Latter part breezy the Island in sight to leeward

Wednesday 8th
Blowing strong from the West with rain. Latter part lighted at some saw Gimbacks

Thursday 9th
Moderated in the night with rain. Spoke the bark Nautilus nothing more of note

Friday 10th
Moderate breeze from the N. stood into Anna Point Bay saw several Gimbacks found the castings on the rudder head cracked and employed the day repairing them so ends

Saturday 11th
Moderate breeze from the N. saw large quantities of Gimbacks Secorro bearing N 20 miles distant

Sunday 12th
Moderate breeze from the S & W with fog nothing of note observed

Cruising

Monday Oct-13th 79
Moderate breeze from the S & W during the first & mid part. Latter part breezy from the Westward vessel steering into the S & W
Lat-45°30'
Lon 76°17'

Tuesday 14th
With strong breezes from the N. and thick weather. Latter part moderate with frequent hail squalls saw Gimbacks
Lat-45°20'
Lon 76°22'

Wednesday 15th
With strong breezes from the Westward vessel steering into the N. saw Gimbacks & Comps
Lat-45°38'
Lon 76°23'

Thursday 16th
Moderated some matter part wind squaled into the S & W vessel steering E. & E. sighted Secorro; employed the time making spinnaker

Friday 17th
Fresh breeze from the S & W with rain nothing of note occurred

Saturday 18th
Breezy from the S & W with rain. Mid part wind shifted into the S. Latter part calm repaired the fore & mast stay sail the watch employed making spinnaker saw a sail nothing more of note
