

Cruising

Sunday Oct-10th 1877
Calms & light - falling air
from all sides latter part
light breeze from the
W. saw a Right Whale
going quick to windward
lowered and chased a
few pieces, and gave up
the Island bearing E by S.
distance 30 miles

Monday 20th
Fair weather with light
air from the S.W. and
calms broke out latter
part - saw the Nautilus
chasing Right Whales going
South
Lat 44° 15' N
Lon 75° 05' W

Tuesday 21st
Fresh breeze from the S and
S.W. vessel stirring into
the Westward the greater
part of this day saw two
Right Whales going quick
to windward. Nautilus in
sight nothing more of note
Lat 44° 16' N
Lon 77° 32' W

Wednesday 22nd
Moderated wind continued
to Westward with fog squalls
saw the Nautilus
Lat 44° 40' N
Lon 77° 37' W

Thursday 23rd
Moderate with frequent fog
small vessel passing into
the S.W. nothing more of
note

Cruising

Friday Oct-24th
Strong breeze and thick fog
nothing of note occurred

Saturday 25th
Blowing from the S and
raining latter part - moderate
sea wind hauled into the
S. vessel working into the
S. saw the Nautilus astern

Sunday 26th
Strong breeze from the S.W.
thick fog latter part - blowing
a sea swell running
Lat 45° 15' N
Lon 80° 06' W

Monday 27th
Light breeze from the S
the S.W. in period the day
into the S. the greater
part of the day saw
Right Whales and the
Nautilus
Lat 45° 08' N
Lon 80° 02' W

Tuesday 28th
Strong breeze from the
Westward latter part - wind
hauled into the S.W. vessel
stirring into the S.E. the
greater part of this day
saw Right Whales and caught
a porpoise
Lat 44° 01' N
Lon 75° 37' W

Wednesday 29th
Fresh breeze from the S - Right
Whales going quick
to S.W. lowered and chased
out sight of vessel and gave them
up also saw the Nautilus chasing
