

Cruising
Thursday Oct 30th 1879.
Wind died out - Calm - did
not - at a time from the
Westward latter part wind
hauling into the N blowing
strong and raining saw
the Nautilus to seaward

Friday 31st
Blowing fresh and thick
fog - Nautilus

Saturday Nov 1st 1879
Blowing strong from the N
saw the Nautilus to the west
chasing Right Whales

Lat - 44° 15'
Long 79° 25'

Sunday 2nd
Blowing strong wind caught
into the N. latter part
blowing a Gale

Monday 3rd
Wind shifted into the S.W.
and blowing a Gale

Tuesday 4th
Blowing heavy shift - from S
that the sail vessel lay
easy under three lower stay
sails and goose winged the fore
sail saw several Whales going
off to seaward just at dark
did not lower

Lat - 44° 40'
Long 78° 25'

Cruising
Wednesday Nov 5th 1879
Moderating gradually Daylight
made sail and kept on
I raised a Right Whale
and lowered the whale went
to seaward and we came
on board nothing more of
note

Thursday 6th
Began with light breezes
from the N.W. and latter
well running mid part of the
latter part fresh breeze from
the Westward repaired the
fore & after sail and broke
out water

Lat - 44° 35'
Long 79° 25'

Friday 7th
With fresh whistling breezes
from S.W. & N.W. latter part
wind from the N. and blowing
a Gale stored the fore & after
sail

Saturday 8th
Wind caught back into the
N.W. with heavy squalls
of wind rain & hail vessel
laid easy

Lat - 45° 07'
Long 80° 20'

Sunday 9th
Blowing fresh from the N.W.
and equally saw several
Murchantitea steering into
the N.

Lat - 45° 18'
Long 80° 40'
