 the Milton to windward

 With strong breeze from
 the Westward and hauled
 saw a Right Whale and
 chased without success

Friday 14th
 With strong Westerly winds
 and rugged saw a Right
 Whale and kept run of him
 about 6 hours waiting for the
 weather to moderate enough
 to lower also saw the ship
 Milton to windward

Monday 17th
 With fresh breeze from the
 Westward and hauled into
 the S to make single tacked
 up hauled and saw a
 Right Whale going quick to
 windward also saw two whales
 to leeward
 Lat 46° 00'
 Lon 80° 00'

Tuesday 18th
 With fresh breeze from
 the W. & W. saw Right Whales
 and chased without success
 spoke the Milton & hauled
 set up harrier and chased
 but saw nothing of note

Wednesday 19th
 With moderate breeze from
 the S during first part
 latter part wind hauled into
 the S & chased Right
 Whales twice this day
 Lat 46° 26'
 Lon 81° 00'
