

Cruising
Friday Dec 26th 1879
Fine weather, and light air
from the N. vessel steering
SE nothing more to note

Saturday 27th
Moderate breeze from the
S. light air from the N. vessel
employed watching some other
part - sailing

Sunday 28th
Wind came out into the N. B
rain in some under the
B. vessel and stopped for
the N. vessel - Rain fell
in sight ahead

Monday 29th
Breeze with light and light
air from the N. Mid East
sailing latter part wind
landed into the Westward
and thick weather. Clearing
bearing about SE by S 3 miles
sight

Tuesday 30th
With moderate breeze from
the N. & S. and thick
weather saw the Island
also a whale

Wednesday 31st
With fresh breeze from the
N. saw the vessel
and another ship cutting
and saw the whaling
windward. Whales in
sight off the beam
at ends. Blue year

Cruising
Thursday Jan 1st 1880
With fresh breeze from the N.
Mid East wind increasing with
again latter part blowing a
gale saw several sail and
caught two porpoises

Friday 2nd
Moderated with a better part
strong breeze and a squally
rain several sail

Saturday 3rd
Moderated some with the N. B
stagnant and got our letters
latter part with light air
from the N. B. spoke the N. B.
Pantilus, Quercia and bounding
Willow

Sunday 4th
Fine weather with good breeze
from the N. spoke the N. B.
and Jacob Howland about
5 P.M. made the Quercia to
Creward whaling. soon
after saw whales going
quick to windward no chance
no ends.

Monday 5th
Breeze with moderate breeze and
good weather about 7 AM
raised the Jacob Howland
to forward whaling. lowered
and our Harbour Boat
went on and got out 10 AM
got him fluted and got dinner
and worked on got him and
8 PM got the watcher
saw the Stamboul take a
Whale
