

Off Juan Hernandez
11 Friday Feb 22-1880

Began with moderate breeze
from the SW and thick weather
which part-raining latter part
wind shifted into the South East
finished boiling the Island
in sight.

Saturday 23rd
With fresh breeze from the SE
got over oil from the Scutellus
and stowed down about
50 lbs of it. Saw in sight
distant about 40 miles.

Sunday 24th
With strong breeze from the
SE vessel steering into the
Westward all day sunset
the Island about 18 miles
distant about 10 miles.

Monday 25th
With strong breeze from the SE
stowing down and
Cass at 4 on at 6 am trading
got about 2 flint potatoes and
half a Hiilock: sold 75 ft of
Board-Boards and two lbs of Boat
nails nothing more of note.

Tuesday 26th
With strong breeze from the
SE vessel steering SE by W
about 4 PM passed the
side of Massachusetts spoke
the Scutellus and Clappa
employed the day washing
part-work.

Off Massachusetts
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Wednesday Feb 27th 1880
With strong breeze from the
SE and thick weather
saw several whales.

Thursday 28th
With thick weather and
fresh breeze from the SE
employed scraping, field-work
this day spoke the Jacob Howland.

Friday 29th
With fresh breeze from the
SE vessel steering into the
Eastward all this day
broke out thunder. Weather
clear nothing more of note.
Lat- 33-45
Lon 85-00

Saturday 30th
With strong breeze from
the SE vessel steering
into the Eastward the greater
part of this day saw
the Island and weather fair
also saw five whales.

Sunday 31st
With strong breeze from the SE
vessel steering into the Eastward
latter part wind calmed more
into the SE sunset the Island
bearing about SE by W 80 miles.
