Thursday Mch 11th 1880
Fine weather employed washing
ship outside and setting up
black sunset sent the watch
ashore

Friday 12th
Employed setting up Shocks and
rattling down the mast; rigging also
set up the Mizen & Mast back stays
watch went and came as usual

Saturday 13th
Employed scraping and painting
iron work. setting up shocks & co
watch went and came as usual

Sunday 14th
Fine weather Stab watch on liberty
nothing more of note

Monday 15th
Moderate weather got underway
and came in nearer the beach
and hoisted out all the oil on Port
side in After hold. watch went and
came as usual

Tuesday 16th
Breezing from the N and stormy stowed
the ground tier on Port side and filled
it with water. watch went and came
as usual

Wednesday 17th
Blowing and raining nothing more
of note sent the cruisers ashore

Thursday 18th
Good weather hoisted the remainder of
the oil in After hold and hoisted it
nothing more of note

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Friday Mch 19th 1880
Good weather took our stores on board
from J. A. Brown and finished
coopering and filling our oil kepi-
the watch on board this night

Saturday 20th
Good weather shipped 6120 galls
six thousand one hundred twenty galls
of sperm oil on board Bark & A Brown
land put on some new copper on
Stab side

Sunday 21st
Fine weather watch ashore on liberty

Monday 22nd
With fine weather employed stowing
back in After hold & co watch
went and came as usual

Tuesday 23rd
Fine weather got our Reef & Tow Line
and Bows from shore also a set
of Shocks bought from Milton. the
Bark Cape Horn Pigeon sailed
for Home

Wednesday 24th
Employed Rattling the top Mast
rigging and took six cords of wood
from the J. A. Brown

Thursday 25th
With fine weather painted the Bunde
and done several other small jobs
about the vessel sold the Bark
Stamboul 100 lbs of Butter
