

At Salcahuano

Friday Mch 26th 1880
Good weather employed painting
the boom work and began
rattling the main rigging

Saturday 27th
With fine weather finished
rattling the main rigging and
got our boom work from the
Blacksmith and set up the
bol stays

Sunday 28th
With moderate weather watch
ashore on liberty nothing
more of note

Monday 29th
Good weather shipped (3787) galls
of whale by J. J. Brown and hoisted
out about 45 lbs of sperm for chipmunk
watch went and came as usual

Tuesday 30th
With strong South winds shipped the
balance of our oil by J. J. Brown
(4352) galls sperm and (1871) lbs of Bone

Wednesday 31st
With a light North wind and thick
weather employed putting copper
on star side and taking water

Thursday Apr 1st 1881
Employed taking water and getting
potatoes from shore sold (141) yds of
Drillings nothing more of note

At Salcahuano

Friday Apr 2nd 1880.
With good weather employed getting
off recruits also sold (6) lbs of Blubber
watch went and came as usual

Saturday 3rd
Fine weather finished getting our recruits
also finished painting watches went
and came as usual

Sunday 4th
Moderate breeze from the S and
fine morning. The morning the
watch came off from the ship
and the ship went to liberty

Monday 5th
Good weather wind S finished
getting off stores and hoisted
out and got ship ready for
sea discharged Francis Smith
3rd officer and nothing more of
note

Tuesday 6th
Fine weather and good breeze
from the S got our crew aboard
and got underway sunset
the light being 30 1/2 miles
sold (30 lbs of Blubber)

Wednesday 7th
With strong breeze from the
S vessel starting to W saw
the Crantius again and 13 1/2
miles off to seaward
with a whale sunset shortened
sail
