Sunday May 8th 1880
With fresh breeze from
the N.W. spoke the back-
staircase

Monday 9th
A moderate North with rain
saw a sail latter part-
wind hauled into the N.W.
raining yet-

Tuesday 10th
With strong S.W. winds
employed in hauling out
the anchor. Lat- 53. 35
Long 82. 00

Wednesday 11th
Moderate North the boat
hoisted and discharged
3 lbs of powder for the
goal saw the Popocon
to windward and the
Island to leeward

Thursday 12th
With moderate breeze baffling
from the S.W. to S.E. and
thick weather employed
in hauling in blocks.

Friday 13th
With strong breeze from
the N.W. with frequent squalls
A rain broke out water
land threat-

Off Massachus

Saturday May 8th 1880
Blowing and raining from the
S vessel under lower 1/2 sails
and storm stay sails

Sunday 9th
Blowing wind hauled into
the N.W. saw a ship back-

Monday 10th
With strong breeze from the
Westward with frequent
squalls latter part- wind
hauled over to South
vessel steering into the
North all day Lat- 54. 03
Long 82. 45

Tuesday 11th
With strong breeze from
the S.W. vessel steering
into the S.E. saw that
sailing.

Wednesday 12th
With moderate breeze from
S.W. to S.E. vessel steering
into the Eastward delay
in sight- saw a vessel off
our lee and called her the
Gaut Martin

Thursday 13th
With calm & light air
from the Westward
looked over board and
done several other small
jobs.
