

Off Massafuera

Thursday May 27th 1880
With fresh breezes from the West with rain
latter part cleared off
spoke the bark Martin and
Santilus of Jacob Howland

Friday 28th
With fresh breezes from the
Westward nothing of note
occurred
Lat-32-37
Lon 82-28

Saturday 29th
With strong West-winds and
thick weather saw several
finbacks - broke out water
and Butter

Sunday 30th
With Moderate breezes from
Eastward vessel steering
West - nearly all day in
company with the Santilus
saw two more whales at noon
Lat-32-37
Lon 83-17

Monday 31st
Wind hauled into the S with
rain latter part wind got
back to Westward again

Tuesday June 1st 1880
With Moderate breezes from
the N. and thick weather
broke out water and holms
latter part rainy

Off Massafuera

Wednesday June 2nd 1880
Wind increased to a Moderate
Gale latter part wind calmed
into S.W. and moderated
set the fore top sail

Thursday 3rd
Wind hauled back into the
S.W. and began to rain
and blow stowed the fore
top sail latter part moderated
some

Friday 4th
With Calms and light airs from
all points of the compass
saw the bark Chucitia at a
distance

Saturday 5th
Blowing a squall - Gale
from the Westward vessel
laying easy

Sunday 6th
Moderated some vessel
steering into the S.E. & S.
all day spoke the Chucitia

Monday 7th
With light airs land. Calm
employed making sunnet
and sword. That's nothing
more of note
