

Off Massafurra

Monday June 8th 1880
With light breeze from the
SE rolled up the whaler
out and cleared it
about 9 AM raised the
Lucretia chasing whales
soon after raised more
whales and towed and
waist-boat got one
got him alongside and
raised the price nothing
more of note

Tuesday 9th
Moderate Daylight worked on
and sunset got the case
overboard and set the
Lucretia in sight
to leeward

Wednesday 10th
Strong breeze and rain
employed boiling coals
down once at account of
rain

Thursday 11th
With strong west winds and
squally employed boiling
saw Whales just at night
going quick to windward
called them good

Friday 12th
Blowing a gale from the
westward finished boiling
and made secure saw
the Lucretia astern

Off Massafurra

Sunday June 13th 1880
Moderate and wind hauled
into the SE on down
the head oil and spoke
the Lucretia
Sept 30-47
Nov 83-06

Monday 14th
With moderate breeze from
the Eastward finished
stowing down the oil
and washed ship and broke
out water

Tuesday 15th
With light air and Calms
employed stowing into the
SE & SW saw Whales going
quick did not make them
out employed painting soon
work about the decks and
doing several small jobs

Wednesday 16th
With moderate breeze from
the Westward set the
lower fore top sail down and
repaired it - brided the main
and repaired the Mizzen top
The Star sail saw a white
fly to leeward took a whale
alongside Whales came to
windward and we tried
them one rising just at
dark nothing further of
note
