Thursday June 17<sup>th</sup> 1880  
Blowing strong from the S.W. nothing of note occurred

Friday 18<sup>th</sup>  
Blowing a Gale from the S.W. nothing of note occurred

Saturday 19<sup>th</sup>  
Moderated. Latter part fair weather saw several Finbacks  
Lat 32-05  
Lon 82-01

Sunday 20<sup>th</sup>  
Moderate breeze from the S.W. vessel steering into the S.W. all day spoke the Loretta just finished sailing. Also saw two other whales

Monday 21<sup>st</sup>  
Began with moderate breezes from the S.W. hauling gradually into the S.W. and blowing mild & latter part rainy broke out. Breeze & water.

Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Blowing strong from the S.W. vessel heading into the S.W. under easy sail spoke the Gay Martin also saw two other whales to windward nothing more of note

## Cruising

Wednesday June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1880  
Blowing strong and squalls of rain vessel heading into the S.W.

Thursday 24<sup>th</sup>  
Wind died out. Calm latter part got a breeze from the Westward ends with half a Gale and equally

Friday 25<sup>th</sup>  
With strong falling winds from the W. with frequent squalls broke out water saw two whales  
Lat 31-31  
Lon 81-44

Saturday 26<sup>th</sup>  
Moderate breezes from the Westward spoke the Kautela also saw another gale to windward  
Lat 31-16  
Lon 81-34

Sunday 27<sup>th</sup>  
With moderate breezes from the S.W. vessel steering into the S.W. all day.  
Lat 31-47  
Lon 82-03

Monday 28<sup>th</sup>  
Wind calmed into the S.W. and blowing vessel steering S.W. all day in company with the Kautela nothing of note occurred  
Lat 32-20  
Lon 83-08
