Saturday July 10th 1880
Blowing a Gale from the
Westward with rain

Sunday 11th
With strong S.W. winds and
rain. Got up sail stowed
the greater part of the
day
Lat-32-16.
Lon 83-11.

Monday 12th
Blowing a Gale from the
Westward vessel laying
easy

Tuesday 13th
Moderated wind hauled out
CP and rained nearly all
day saw 4 sail and a
Sloopback

Wednesday 14th
Baffling breeze from S to S.W.
saw several sail nothing
more of note

Thursday 15th
Blowing a Gale from the S.W.
vessel laying easy saw nothing

Friday 16th
With light airs from the
Eastward and heavy swell.
spoke the Nautilus with
bow boat close in yesterday's
blow

Cruising

Saturday July 17th 1880
With moderate breeze from
the S & S.W. with thick
rainy weather the Nautilus
Jacob Howland & Hancock
in sight.

Sunday 18th
Began with moderate breezes
and rain from the S
and with a Gale from
same quarter

Monday 19th
Blowing a Gale from the
Eastward for up sail in
Nautilus in sight to seaward
Lat-33-33
Lon 83-37

Tuesday 20th
Moderated wind hauling
around to the S spoke
the Jacob Howland & Nautilus
rather far off

Wednesday 21st
With strong breeze from the
S with squalls of rain vessel
steering into the Eastward
Lat-32-54
Lon 84-09

Thursday 22nd
Calms and light airs
from the S vessel
steering into the Eastward
