

Off Kaafu.

Off Friday Jan 29th 1881
Wind hauled into the S.W.
daylight - kept off S.W. E.
at 10 A.M. raised the
Island also saw three
Santilus to seaward & haling
saw the Guercia take a
Whale. Santilus one Chaucer
struck one and lowered
and chased a few rising
ourselves. Whales went to
windward and wind freshening
with rain saw the Bk
& A Howland to windward
so ends.

Off Saturday 30th
With Calms & light airs
from the S & spoke the Bk
& A Howland & Guercia
the latter cutting a large
whale this eve the wind
shifted into the E so ends

Sunday 31st
Blowing strong from the S
nothing of note occurred

Monday 31st
Blowing strong from the S
saw several Humpbacks
nothing more of note

Tuesday Feb 1st 1881
With moderate breezes from
the S and foggy. Latter
part - wind hauled into the
Westward with rain spoke
Bk & A Howland - nothing more of note

Off Kaafu

Off Wednesday Feb 8th 1881
With fresh S.W. winds and
fog nothing of note occurred

Off Thursday 3rd
High light airs from the
N.W. & S.W. and fog. Latter part clear
the Island bearing E & E
distance about 35 miles

Off Friday 4th
With moderate breezes from
the S.W. & repaired lower
fore top sail. Latter part
foggy

Saturday 5th
With moderate breezes from the
S.W. saw several Humpbacks
and spoke the A Howland
and Santilus about the Island
bearing E 30 miles

Sunday 6th
Began with Calms & light
airs from the S.W. Latter
part - wind freshening from the
S and raining

Monday 7th
With light airs from the S
and Calms. Latter part - windy
& again Island bearing E by S
20 miles

Tuesday 8th
Blowing strong from the Westward
with heavy squalls nothing of
note occurred
