

Off Huaffo.

Wednesday Feb 9th 1881
Blowing strong from the
westward with frequent
squalls nothing of note
occurred

Thursday 10th
Moderate and thick weather
saw several sail and a
clumpack

Lat 42-36
Lon 75-36

Friday 11th
With moderate breeze from
the westward with frequent
squalls spoke the Lancer
and Cape A Rowland also
saw the Santilus and Quercia
take a dead sperm whale
in company that the Santilus
had parted from a few
days previous

Saturday 12th
Wind changed into the
north about 10 A.M. the wind
blowing a calm and raining
rather heavy wind hauled
into the westward still blowing
strong and heavy sea running

Sunday 13th
With strong West winds and
thick weather nothing
of note occurred.

Off Huaffo.

Monday Feb 12th 1881
With light airs and calm
began to water repairs
stoppers and spoke the Santilus
and Quercia nothing more
of note.

Tuesday 15th
With light breeze from the
W. by E. sent the Fore Sail
on Deck and put a new fore-
rope and thoroughly repaired
it - sunset the Island bearing
about E 15 miles distant
saw the Santilus dip
her ensign and steer into
the E

Wednesday 16th
With moderate breeze from
the E nothing of note
occurred

Thursday 17th
With strong breeze from the
South passed close under
the Island and got some
sight. repaired the pit and
done several other small jobs

Friday 18th
With moderate breeze from the
S. about 7 A.M. raised the
Quercia's boats whaling lowered
guns and chased and our whal-
boat got over Quercia and West-
got our catch raised the flag
and took the food and landed
down for the night
