

Off Knappa
Monday Nov 1st 1881
With fresh breezes from
the S.W. vessel steering
E. saw the whole of
fleet and spoke the
J. A. Howland

Tuesday 2nd
With light air from the
S.W. employed shifting sails
and jordan saw several
Humpbacks nothing more of
note

Wednesday 3rd
With moderate breezes from
the S.W. and good weather
the Island bearing N.E. 10
15 miles distant I caught
a sword fish and took new
set of hallards nothing
more of note

Thursday 4th
With fresh breezes from
the S.W. took new lower
jordan and spoke the
J. A. Howland

Friday 5th
With fresh breezes from
the Westward saw several
Humpbacks nothing more
of note

Off Knappa
Saturday Nov 6th 1881
Blowing strong from the W.
and jugged raised spun
whales going quick to
windward lowered two boats
and chased a few risings
and came on board latter
part raining

Sunday 7th
Wind shifted into the
S.W. and blew fresh vessel
making in all day
sunset lacked 2 1/2 the
Island about 18 miles distant

Monday 8th
With light air from the
S.W. part wind hauled
into the Westward saw
the J. A. Howland and Chancer
each take a whale nothing
more of note

Tuesday 9th
With light air from the
S.W. made new set of
pendants sunset the Island
bearing E 12 miles distant

Wednesday 10th
With light air from the S.
and Wain made new set
pendants

Thursday 11th
With light air from the S.
saw large quantities of Blackfish
and Humpbacks caught 4 fish
also made new set of pendants
