

From Pocomo to Cape Horn

Friday April 1st 1881
With strong breeze from
the S.E. all the time - mid-
day - and moderate breeze
all the latter vessel heading
into the S.W. & S. the
greater part of the day

No Ob.

Saturday 2nd
Wind set to land breeze
up from the S.W. and gave
her all sail. Latter part
raining with signs of a
shift took in some sail
Lat-49-28
Lon 81-53

Sunday 3rd
Wind hauled into the N.W.
with heavy squalls
vessel steering S.E. & E. Latter
part wind hauled into
the E. & S. Barometer low
vessel heading into the S
under short sail Lat-52-00
Lon 80-57

Monday 4th
With Calms and light airs
from the S.W. vessel steering
S.E. by E. broke out water
Lat-52-30
Lon 80-35

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Tuesday 5th 1881
This day began with light southerly
airs and falling the barometer
low and giving indication of
a storm. Wind part shorted
down the wind hauled
gradual into the S.E.
Latter part blowing heavy
with squalls

Lat-52-29
Lon 79-01

Wednesday 6th
Wind hauled into the S.W. and
began vessel steering S.E. & E.
Latter part blowing heavy
luffed too. the weather thick
and rainy

Thursday 7th
Began with fresh Gale
from the S.W. and squalls
about 12 M. the weather
cleared and wind hauled
into the W.S.W. and moderated
some daylight kept off E.S.E.
and made some sail
but soon had to take it off
on account of Boats Lat-55-35
Lon 78-30

Friday 8th
Began steering from the
N.E. with squalls vessel
steering S. by E. Latter part
hauled up E. & S. the Gale
increasing stowed the fore sail
and fore top sail.
Lat-57-03
Lon 70-16
