With light airs from the
S. E. and clear weather
finished planing Deck.

Thursday 5th
With fresh breeze vessel
steering S. by E. employed
rattling down lower rigging
overhauling head stays & co
Lat 24-28
Lon 80-27

Friday 6th
With moderate breeze and
well to the S. employed
rattling down and repairing
service about the vessel
Lat 22-26
Lon 79-47
