Tuesday May 17th
With light breeze
vessel steering S.W. by S. 1/2 S.
employed doing small jobs
about the vessel
Lat 29-09 S
Lon 36-26 W

Wednesday May 18th
With light breeze and clear
employed cleaning room rust
and painting vessel steering
S.W. by S. 1/2 S.
Lat 28-25
Lon 37-13

Thursday May 19th
With light breeze from the
S.W. with rain washed
the vessel outside and washed
hoses nothing more of
note

Passage from the Equator to the States

Friday May 20th 1881
With light - E. breeze and the
greater part of this day
employed scrubbing paint work
Lat 04-03
Lon 38-35

Saturday May 21st
With light - air from the
Eastward and Calms
rather part light air
from the S. with rain
finished washing paint -
nothing more of note
Lat 4-45
Lon

Sunday May 22nd
With light - air and Calms
saw Dolphin
Lat 5-17
Lon 40-15

Monday May 23rd
With Calms & light - air
from the S.E. with frequent
rain squalls scrubbed the decks
cleaned out - Lubric room & co.

Tuesday May 24th
With fresh breeze from the
S.W. nearly all this day
with rain squalls vessel
steering S.W. by S.
Lat 7-35
Lon 42-45
