Friday June 30 1881
With light airs from the S.E. the greater part of this day employed scrubbing iron work and several other small jobs about the vessel.

Saturday 1st
With light airs from the Eastward vessel steaming S.W. & employed scrubbing down: about 1 P.M. raised sperm whales hauled and captured two

Sunday 2nd
With moderate breezes from S.W. & vessel steaming S.W. & latter part of day boiling

Lat-23-29
Lon 61-18

Monday 3rd
With calm & light airs from the S.E. finished boiling nothing more of note

Lat-23-56
Lon 61-47

Tuesday June 7th 1881
With light airs from the S.E. vessel steaming S.W. & saw several sail

Lon 62-40

Wednesday 8th
With moderate breezes from the S.E. vessel steaming S.W. & all day stowed down the oil and washed off nothing more of note

Lon 64-43

Thursday 9th
With light baffling winds from S.W. & vessel steaming S.W. & scraped the brightwork. saw one sail

Lat-27-39
Lon 65-49

Friday 10th
With light airs from the S.E. vessel steaming S.W. & employed scraping bright-work

With good breeze from the S.E. vessel steaming S.W. & the weather thick and threatening rain

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
