

Passage from the Equator

Sunday June 12th 1881
 With fresh breezes from the
 S.E. mid part - fair heavy
 with thunder & lightning
 wind shifted into the S.W.
 latter part - clear wind
 caught back into the S.E.
 quarter vessel steering S.W. by E

Monday 13th
 With moderate breeze
 from the S.E. and died
 out - calm mid part fresh
 breeze sprang from the
 S.W. and ends with high-
 baffling rain from all quarters
 scraped spar Lat 30-58
 Lon 82-52

Tuesday 14th
 With clear weather and
 moderate S.W. winds
 vessel steering S.W. saw
 several sail and hoarded
 the Italian, Barque Monte A.
 of Genoa from Catharogenia
 for Baltimore with crew on
 board & latter part with
 high baffling winds from
 the S.W. with rain squalls

 Lon 70-59

to the United States

Wednesday June 15th 1881
 With high baffling winds
 from the S.W. & S.E.
 mid part - wind from the
 N.W. good breeze latter part
 squalls and calm vessel
 steering S.W. the greater
 part of the day crossed
 the "stream" and threw
 overboard our log works

Lat 36-22
 Lon 71-20

Thursday 16th
 Got a breeze from the S.W.
 vessel working to windward
 short tacks & after out-
 water got the offing of the
 bow and stowed away our
 weighing gear

Lat 37-32
 Lon 70-33

Friday 17th
 With baffling winds from
 the S.W. mid part - wind
 hauled into the S.W. vessel
 steering S.W. saw several
 sail and ends with thick
 weather

Lat 39-31
 Lon 71-10
