The first part moderate breezes middle part strong breezes latter part very squally under short sail heading S. St. S. No obs

Lat 26.51 Long 24.69

Friday Oct 24th

The first part heavy squalls of wind and rain have to under close reefed top sails latter part strong breezes from the N. St. St. St. St. St. under single reefed top sails and courses

No obs Lat 27.50 Long 23.47

Saturday Oct 25th

The first part strong breezes from the W. wind middle part the same latter part wind W. to W. St. St. course S. St. St.

Obs Lat 26.11 Long 22.54

Sunday Oct 26th

These 24 hours wind S. St. to W. St. and squally course S. St. St. one sail in sight

Lat 24.08 Long 22.14

Monday Oct 27th

The first part S. St. St. wind W. to W. St. middle part heading S. to S. St. E. latter part the same heavy swell from the N. St. E. colored water

Lat 22.48 Long 21.48

Tuesday Oct 28th

The first part light airs heading S. St. E. middle and latter part light baffling winds looked as occasioned required

Lat 21.36 Long 21.00

Wednesday Oct 29th

The first part light airs and calm at 11 PM light airs from N. St. E. St. St. St. by S. latter part St. St. St. clearing sails set

Lat 20.51 Long 20.17

Thursday Oct 30th

Course S. St. St. wind W. latter part St. St. St. St. St. looked for black fish with out success

Lat 19.18 Long 19.45

Friday Oct 31st 1851

Saturday Nov 1st

Course S. St. St. moderate breezes from the N. St. nothing seen latter part St. St. St. St.

Lat 16.00 Long 21.47

Sunday Nov 2nd

Course S. St. St. St. fine breeze from the N. St. nothing seen

Lat 13.48 Long 22.48

Monday Nov 3rd

Course S. St. St. St. wind N. St. saw black fish repairing main sail

Lat 12.11 Long 23.25

Tuesday Nov 4th

The first moderate middle and latter part the same finished repairing main sail but it could not be Black fish with out success

Lat 10.45 Long 23.45

Wednesday Nov 5th

The first part light airs took a squall from the S. St. St. middle and latter part wind N. St. St. St.

Lat 9.44 Long 24.00

Thursday Nov 6th

The first light airs from the N. St. St. St. had a squall from the S. St. St. middle and latter part light airs from the N. St. St. St. St. saw an English Bark St. to the N

Lat 8.50 Long 25.50

Friday Nov 7th

The first part calm with light showers of rain latter and got 2 black fish middle and latter part light airs from the N. St. St. St. St. setting up top mast back stays and top snail rigging

Lat 8.38 Long 26.32

Saturday Nov 8th

These 24 hours light airs and calm repaired main top gallant sail killed the Black fish

Lat 5.17 Long 27.15

Sunday Nov 9th

The first part calm middle and latter part light airs from the E. St. E. heading to the South
