Saturday Sept 4/52

The first part moderate breeze from the WSW middle part strong breezes latter part squally 4 sail in sight

Lat 38.36 Long 29.05

Sunday Sept 5th

The first strong breezes from the WSW spoke ship big calm clear middle part heavy squalls of wind and rain from the N have to under close reefed top sails took up the board latter part more moderate heading to the E and made sail 2 sail in sight

Lat 38.69 Long 29.25

Monday Sept 6th

The first moderate with a heavy swell 4 P.M. calm 7 P.M. light breezes from the SSW at 11 light to at 4 P.M. calm at 1 P.M. S.E. at 12 P.M. close in to the shore Fagal bore E by N Dist 15 miles so ends

Tuesday Sept 7th

The first part wind S.E. to S at 4 P.M. close in to the shore at 6 P.M. tacked to the SSW middle part heavy squalls of wind and rain latter part the same at 10 the wind shifted to the SSW at 12 M Fagal bore E by N Dist 15 miles spoke Bark Joseph Butler daybreak so ends

Wednesday Sept 8th

The first part strong breezes from the WSW and squally middle part more moderate latter part went on shore at Fagal so ends

Thursday Sept 9th

The first part laying off and on of Fagal middle part at 12 to the SSW of the land latter part wind SSW tacked as occasion required so ends 4 sail in sight

Friday Sept 10

The first part fine breezes from the SSW heading to the N at 5 P.M. tacked ship middle part short sail fog squalls at 8 P.M. spoke Bark Talbot hauling a 60 lb whale 140 m latter part about calm so ends

Saturday Sept 11th

The first part light air from the SSW at E by N spoke ship ship Bark Pearl at London middle part short sail latter part S.E. to S.E. at 12 M between St George and Pico so ends

Sunday Sept 12th

The first S.E. at 6 P.M. off the E end of St George middle part short sail rain squalls latter part wind WSW at 10 P.M. for Lureira so ends

Lat 38.27 Long 27.48

Monday Sept 13th

The first part strong breezes at 4 P.M. off the S.E. end of Lureira middle part light air and calm latter part light air from the SSW sent down the fore top sail yard to put on new jaws so ends

Lat 38.39 Long 26.48

Tuesday Sept 14th

The first part light breezes from the SSW at 3 P.M. sent up the fore top sail yard and sent fore top sail middle part short sail latter part heading to the S.E. one sail in sight

Lat 38.30 Long 26.25

Wednesday Sept 15th

The first part strong breezes from the S heading to the S.E. middle part short sail latter part heading to the N more strong breezes and squally the barometer down to 29.85

Lat 38.28 Long 26.73

Thursday Sept 16th

The first part strong breezes from the S.E. and squally heading to the N at 4 P.M. wind shifted to the SSW more ship to the south at 12 M St Michael bore south 20 miles Dist

Barometer down to 29.85

Friday Sept 17th

The first part blowing fresh from the N more home heading to the N at 7 P.M. wind shifted to the SSW more ship heavy swell from the WSW at 11 by S under short sail more moderate barometer rising latter part S.E. strong breezes from the N.E. West end of St Michael bore NNE so ends

Saturday Sept 18th

The first part strong breezes at 6 P.M. at St Mary's bore S.E. 20 miles middle part short sail by the wind latter part moderate at 12 M strong S.E. by E Dist 8 miles so ends 3 sail in sight
