

Sunday August 21st
The first part off St George latter part shore for
reindeer wind from the N one sail seen
so ends

Monday Aug 22nd
The first part light breezes from the N laying off
and an St George at 3 P.M. came off middle part
calm at 8 A.M. went on shore with 10 last for
water at 10 light airs from the SE one bark off Pico
so ends

Tuesday Aug 23rd
The first light airs at 3 P.M. got the water off
stoned is between decks middle part light breezes from
the SE St to the NW between St George and Pico
latter part light breezes from the NNE heading
to the NW at 11 bark close in with Fajal 5 Whales
seen so ends

Wednesday Aug 24th
The first part light airs from the N St by the
wind back as occasion required middle part the
same latter part laying off and an Fajal
so ends

Thursday Aug 25th
The first part light breezes at 2 P.M. came on
board St out to the SE latter St by the
wind to the N at 11 backed to the NNE
at 12 a spoke bark George Washington
no oil on board the Wind of Fajal bearing
NE dist 15 miles
so ends

Friday Aug 26th
The first part moderate breezes from the N middle
part strong breezes latter part blowing fresh from
the N wind at and squally see jumpers
off the Wends of Fajal so ends

Saturday Aug 27th
The first part blowing fresh and squally
middle part thunder lightning and rain
latter blowing fresh 4 sail upon ship
as occasion required so ends

The first part blowing fresh from the NNE
heading to the SE middle part more
moderate latter part calm ends with
light breezes from the SE heading to the
ENE a number of sail in sight bark
of Pico bearing NE dist 20 miles
so ends

Monday Aug 29th
The first part St. Nelly off at 4 P.M.
see a Merchant Bark with her ensign set
half mast set ans and St for her at 4 P.M.
sent the Mate to her she proved to be
the Bark Francis Palmer from Seis-leon
with the African Thores on board mounted
assistance to get in to Fajal did not
think it was prudent to send any body
she was close in to the harbor at sunset
I feel very bad to think I could not render
them any assistance if she had not been
so near in should need to have helped them
middle rainy heading to the NNE latter
part strong breezes from the NE St by the
wind to the N 4 sail in sight the
Wind of Fajal bearing ESE by compass dist
3 miles

Tuesday Aug 30th
The first part wind NE at 6 P.M. Fajal 15 miles
dist middle light wind latter part empty repairing
mizen stay sail and fore top gallant beat the best
one to the main 2 sail in sight

Lat 38.47 Long 29.24

Wednesday Aug 31st
The first part calm latter part moderate breezes
from the SE heading off Fajal 4 sail in sight
no Whales so ends
