Friday Sept 1st 1854

The first strong breezes from the NNE
ESE middle short sail bearing ESE and
NNW wind from the N at 5 AM saw
Flores bearing ESE at 8 AM
several sail in sight do ends

Saturday Sept 2nd
The first part fine breeze from the NNE
at 4 AM ship at 6 close in to the off
end of Flores about came along side from
the shore spoke ship for nations that land
all well clear middle part squally and
calm latter part light airs from the ESE at
by the wind lashed as occasion required seen
close in to the land

Sunday Sept 3rd 1854
The first part light airs and calm at 4 PM
a boat came off to trade for resins the tobacco
was to poor ~~could~~ not sell it middle
part light airs from the NNE at 8 AM
latter part light airs and calm 7 sail in
sight the off end of Flores bearing
NNE 20 miles do ends

Monday Sept 4th
These 24 hours light airs from SE off to
South and calm at by the wind to the
Eward several sail seen

Tuesday Sept 5th
The first part light airs from the South
middle and latter part the same lashed
as occasion required 3 sail in sight

Wednesday Sept 6th
The first light breezes from the South
leading to the NNE at 4 PM lashed
to the ESE at 6 PM saw Fayal
bearing ESE middle part fresh breeze
lashed as occasion required latter
part blowing fresh from the SE off
at 12. Fayal bore S. dist 10 miles
do ends

Thursday Sept 7th
The first part blowing fresh from the SE off
at 1 PM more ship heading to the off
most under easy sail at 2 PM wind shifted
to the NNE latter strong breezes from the
North at by the wind to the ENE at
12 M the breeze at George and Fayal
several sail seen do ends
