Wednesday April 4th
These 24 hours light wind heading to
the N E Breacking out West

Sat 12.24 Long 171.42

Thursday April 5th
The first part light buffling winds middle
part the same latter part calm sent down
the fore top sail repairing it so ends

No Obs Sat 12.00 Long 171.42

Friday April 6th
These 24 hours light air calm and rainy
at 4 PM bent fore top sail set fore top
mast at sail for the first time at 10 PM
took it in wind all round the compass

No Obs Sat 10.50 Long 171.50

Saturday April 7th
These 24 hours buffling winds and squally
bent main Bunt sent it up so ends

Obs Sat 10.42 Long 171.58

Sunday April 8th
The first part wind from the N and
squally at 4 PM saw a school of
Sper Whales to windward at 4 1/2 hours
at sunset got near enough to see three
break out of the back's middle part an
different latter blowing from the N
nothing seen

Sat 10.09 Long 172.00

Monday April 9th
These 24 hours wind variable and squally
took several times nothing seen

Sat 9.33 Long 171.51

Tuesday April 10th
The first light air from the N^W and calm
heading to the N at 1 PM saw Duke of Clarence
see the bearing N E by E dist 25 miles one
sail in sight to the E ward
sent down mizen top mast - it was so rotten
the top-gallant mast broke of sending it
down middle part about calm latter part
light air from the SE at 11 PM by N
Duke of Clarence & Duke of Yorks both
in sight one ship set to the W ward

Sat
Wednesday April 11th
The first part light air and squally sent
up mizen top mast middle latter part light wind
from the SE compass setting up rigging ke

Thursday April 12th
The first part light air from the SE at
11 PM by N^W latter part calm & employed
in various jobs
