Tuesday June 5/55

The first part blowing fresh from the SE and SSE thick Fog middle part the same latter part the same at 6 A.M. heading to the SE under double reefed top sails and fore sail clear at intervals so ends

Wednesday June 6th

The first part little more moderate at 3 P.M. set the jib and spinnaker at 4 took off thick Fog took in jib and spinnaker middle part heading off and on latter part cleared up a little at 6 A.M. saw the land at 8 A.M. lured for a Whale with out success at 9 lured again saw 3 proved to be Rip Sacks the L Boat struck and sunk him came in thick and rainy so ends

Thursday June 7th

The first part thick and rainy wind SE heading off and on under double reefed top sails and fore sail jib and spinnaker at 6 A.M. took in jib and spinnaker middle and latter blowing fresh with rain and Fog under double reefed top sails and fore sail heading off and on at 10 close in shore more off so ends

Friday 8th

The first part blowing fresh from the SE at 1 P.M. took in fore top sail heading off then middle part the same latter part heading in thick rainy weather so ends

Saturday June 9/55

The first part more moderate made sail at 3 1/2 saw the land at 6 saw the Deer rip sack took him along side cut him in middle part thick and rainy latter part boiling rainy weather land 6 miles distant so ends

Sunday June 10th

The first part cloudy with light rain and calm at 7 P.M. finished boiling about 12 miles middle and latter part calm and thick Fog so ends

Monday June 11th

The first part light air from the NNE at 2 P.M. the Fog light up at 3 P.M. saw the Bow head lured and got one middle part cut him in at 12 finished latter part heading shore at 9 A.M. saw several Whales close in lured and got one Deer stranded got 15 Fathoms so ends

Tuesday June 12th

The first part strong breezes from the NE at 1 P.M. took the Whale along side at 2 began to cut at 8 finished cutting at 2 1/2 P.M. commenced boiling latter part heading to windward at 11 A.M. saw 12 miles so ends

Lat 39.38 Long

Wednesday 13

The first part moderate breezes from the NE at 1 P.M. lured the L Boat struck lost a line made sail heading to windward latter part lured for Whales proved to be Rip Sacks saw one Bow head so ends
