employed boiling and stowing down Oil

Monday 13th Tuesday Aug 14th

The first part light airs and calm the weather
latter part light wind from the S.W. with
fog squall saw Whales several came
in thick took the boats up one ship
in sight

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Tuesday 14th Wednesday Aug 15th

The first part strong breezes from the S.W.
boiling stowing after hole at 2 P.M. looked down
latter part slight saw six each one saw
heads

Wednesday 15th Thursday Aug 16th

These 24 hours blowing fresh from the
N.E. by E and reefed employed stowing after
hole have to

Thursday 16th Friday Aug 17th

The first part blowing fresh from the
N.E. and reefed finished stowing down
latter part moderate breeze from the
N.E. employed clearing up deck
& ships one Bark in sight

Friday 17th Saturday Aug 18th

Haverly strike a Whale and lose it
latter part light airs and calm 2 boats
cruising for Whales employed drying

Saturday 18th Sunday Aug 19th

The first undisturbed winds at 6 P.M. the
Boats came on board with success
latter part light breezes S.W. to the West
in long shore saw one boat near
at 12 P.M. saw the Huntsville chasing
Whales

Sunday 19th Monday Aug 20th

The first fresh breezes from the S.W.
the 2nd boat got a Whale at 5 P.M.
took him along side close in shore
lower off at 1 P.M. done too blowing
fresh and reefed at 6 A.M. began to cut
at 1 P.M. finished lost the head
