

Remarks on Board Ship Hesper

Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup>

This day light breeze from the  
at 10 A.M. lowered the Mast Boat and the  
capt went ashore ship lying off and on at  
Bayall at 10 P.M. the lighter came off and took  
our oil 132 bbls ashore Mast Boat helped  
two men in the cooper got medicine at 10 1/2  
evening the carpenter in liquor cursing the  
capt Put him in irons at 7 1/2 the capt  
came on Board stood out to sea steering  
S S W bound south so ends the day

Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup>

This day fine breeze from N N W  
steering S S W at 6 A.M. to brace the  
yards and luffed to the wind on the Star  
tack heading for the Island of Rice at 3 P.M.  
about one mile from southern shore kept off  
and run down shore at 6 P.M. took in  
light sails and steered S by E, Pickling  
Onions carpenter in irons one sail in sight

Thursday 29<sup>th</sup>

This day strong breeze from W steering  
E S E at 12 P.M. saw land St Michaels  
at 3 P.M. steering S by W at 6 P.M. saw  
St Marys about 20 miles distant  
bearing about S E this day taking care  
of onions and Potatoes also Dumping one sail  
in sight ship under double reefed topsails so  
carpenter out of irons

Friday 30<sup>th</sup>

the first part of this day strong winds from W S W  
steering S by E latter part light winds  
steering S nothing in sight so ends

Bound South of Hamblin wasted  
Oct

Saturday 1<sup>st</sup>

This day light winds from S W ship  
on the Star tack this day Repairing stowed  
Boat star one one sail in sight passed  
a piece of a wreck it looked like a piece  
of the Bottom appeared to have been in  
Water some time, nothing more so ends

Sunday 2<sup>d</sup>

This day light breeze from S W ship  
on Starboard tack 7 A.M. tacked ship  
saw spars & c nothing in sight so ends

Monday 3<sup>d</sup>

This day strong winds or light gale from S W  
steering S E W rain through the day  
nothing in sight so ends the day

Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup>

This day strong breeze from  
steering S S W second mate off duty on  
account of sickness
