Remarks on board the Ship *James Arnold* of  
Sunday July the 28<sup>th</sup> 1867  
First part still employed hauling  
the weather very light at sunset took  
in gally light sails & wore ship to the  
South the weather very cloudy at  
2 AM commenced raining still employed  
hauling at Daylight rain very heavy stop  
hauling took in fore & main top sails the  
weather very thick so ends the Day

Monday July the 29<sup>th</sup>  
First part light rain at 2 PM clear  
up at 4 PM commenced hauling again the  
weather very pleasant the ship heading  
S. W. under double reefed main top sail  
& fore sail middle part fore & pleasant  
weather still employed hauling at 12 PM  
finished hauling the whale so ends the  
Day

Tuesday July the 30<sup>th</sup>  
First part employed clear up the  
ship heading W. by N. under double  
reefed top sails fore & fore sail at sunset  
the weather very pleasant middle part  
fore light weather at Daylight com-  
menced hauling the sail save a sail to  
the West the ship heading to the  
North with all sail set so ends the  
Day

Wednesday July the 31<sup>st</sup>  
First part employed hauling the sail  
save fore sail & got one at sunset wore  
ship to the W. & took in all sail but  
double reefed top sails the sail still  
insight at Daylight commenced break-  
ing out fore & stacking down the  
weather light so ends the Day

Pope Bradford in the Pacific Ocean during the summer  
Thursday August the First 1867 Whaler  
First part employed stood down all the  
weather very thick & raining & fresh breeze  
at 2 PM saw a sail at sunset finished  
stacking the sail the weather very cloudy  
middle & latter part light pleasant  
weather employed on the ship duty so  
ends the Day

Friday August the 2<sup>nd</sup>  
First part employed on the ship duty  
saw fin backs at sunset took in fore  
& main top sail, & fore middle & latter  
part moderate weather at Daylight  
set all sail save a fore back, the  
Abraham Barker insight the 2 ships,  
heading to the North so ends the Day

Saturday August the 3<sup>rd</sup>  
First part commenced pointing the  
main mast the Abraham Barker still  
insight still heading to the North  
at sunset took in all sail all but  
double reefed top sail, & fore sail & wore  
ship to the South middle & latter part  
calm employed on the ship duty  
the Abraham Barker still insight so  
ends the Day

Sunday August the 4<sup>th</sup>  
First part did calm still employed  
on the ship duty at sunset the  
Abraham Barker insight middle  
part very light weather at Daylight  
set all sail the Abraham Barker  
still insight heading to the  
W. by N. the same a fin back  
for passes the weather very pleasant  
so ends the Day
