

Remarks on Board the Ship *Janet* and *Agnes*
Wednesday September the 18th 1867
First part employed repairing mizen
top sail at 4 pm saw sperm *Whale*
but to late middle & better part
calm still repairing sails saw 12th
so ends the Day

Thursday September the 19th
First part still employed repairing
sails still calm at 4 pm finished
repairing sails the ship heading *S W*
at sunset the weather very pleasant
middle & better part squally & rain
saw nothing so ends the Day

Friday September the 20th
First part squally & rain the ship
heading from *S W* to *S by E* at 3 pm
saw 4 ship sailing at sunset double
reefed the top sail, still raining
middle part light weather at
daylight set all sails the *Abraham*
baraker in sight saw nothing so ends
the Day

Saturday September the 21st
First part employed painting the
Boat, with fresh breeze took in all top
sail, at sunset took in all sail all
but double reefed main top sail
middle & better part more mo-
derate saw 4 sail steering to the
South so ends the Day

New Bedford in the Pacific ocean
Cruising for sperm *Whales*
Sunday September the 22nd 1867
First part light wind, tattering by the
wind heading to the South at sunset
calm took in the flying jib & main
sail middle & better part light wind
saw nothing so ends the Day

Monday September the 23rd
First part fine pleasant weather
& very light wind middle part
calm at 7 am commenced turning
the mizen rigging still calm saw
nothing so ends the Day

Tuesday September the 24th
still employed turning mizen rig-
ging still calm at 5 pm finished
turning the mizen rigging at sunset
still calm middle part light
breeze at daylight still employ-
ed at mizen rigging saw 4th bark
so ends the Day

Wednesday September the 25th
First part in place on mizen rig-
ging the ship heading *S W* at
with all sail on saw 4th bark at
sunset took in all sail all but
double reefed top sail, & fore sail
middle & better part calm
still employed on the mizen rigging
saw nothing so ends the Day
