Thursday September the 26th 1867
this day commenced with calm & very
breezy still employed on the rigging at
sunset the weather very cloudy &
squally took in the light sail, latter
part the same so ends the Day

Monday Gilvor
Friday September the 27th
first part very cloudy & light
wind at sunset double reefed the
top sail, at Daylight saw the Sunday
Island so ends the Day

Saturday September the 28th
first part still insight of the
Island the weather very cloudy &
light rain so ends the Day

Sunday September the 29th
this day commenced with light
rain & cloudy the Ship starting
S.I.W. with all sail set saw nothing
so ends the Day

Monday September the 30th
this day commenced with rain & light
wind the ship heading S by W at
sunset double reefed the top sail
weather still very cloudy middle &
latter part the same so ends the Day

of the Reef in the Pacific Ocean

Tuesday October the 1st 1867
all this day heavy fine breeze & thick
the ship heading S.I.W. saw finbacks
so ends the Day

Wednesday October the 2nd
this day commenced with very thick
weather saw many finbacks at sunset
took in all sail all but double
reefed main top sail & fore sail latter
part the same so ends the Day

Thursday October the 3rd
first part very thick saw many
finbacks at sunset took in all sail
all but double reefed main top
sail & fore sail double reefed & latter part
the same saw many finbacks the
ship heading S.I.W. at sunset
took in all sail so ends the Day

Friday October the 4th
first part still very thick still
many finbacks insight the ship
still heading to the S.I.W. at
sunset took in all sail all
but double reefed main top sail
& fore sail middle & latter part
the same so ends the Day
