

Remarks on Board the ship *Jane Amiel* of
Sunday October the 15th 1867
all this 24 hours moderate gale from
South the ship heading S.W. by W.
saw Nothing so ends this Day

Wednesday October the 16th
First part more moderate set fore
sail at 2 pm set fore & mizen
sails double reefed at sunset were
ship to the S. E. Middle & latter part
moderate gale saw Nothing so ends
the Day

Thursday October the 17th
all this 24 hours fresh winds & thick
weather the ship heading South
under double reefed main top sail
& fore sail with light rain
saw Nothing so ends this Day

Friday October the 18th
First part more moderate still
thick the ship still heading South
at 2 pm set fore & mizen top sails
& fore at sunset took them in
middle & latter part light
weather saw fin back so ends the
Day

Saturday October the 19th
all this 24 hours moderate weather
the ship heading W. by S. with
all sail set saw one fin back
the weather very pleasant so ends
the Day

New Bedford in the Pacific Ocean looking
for sperm
Sunday October the 20th 1867
this day commenced with very pleasant
weather the ship heading W. by S. with
all sail on saw one fin back at sunset
took in all light sail, & double reefed
the top sails still steering by the wind
heading to the W. Middle & latter part
strong wind, & very cloudy, saw Nothing
so ends this Day

Monday October the 21st
First part commenced with light
winds & very thick & rain saw fin back
at 3 pm were ship to the N. E. at
sunset took in all sail all but double
reefed main top sail & fore sail
steering by the wind heading N. E.
Middle & latter part fresh winds
saw fin back so ends this Day

12 2 11
Tuesday October the 22nd
First part still fresh winds from
S. W. the ship steering South &
N. E. at sunset reefed to two the
wind heading South under double
reefed main top sail & fore sail
latter part fresh gale saw Nothing
so ends the Day

Wednesday October the 23rd
First part still fresh gale from the
S. W. the ship heading North latter
the same saw Nothing so ends the
Day
