

Remarks on Board the Ship James A. Smith
Friday November the 1st 1867

First part fresh wind, from S the ship
steering W by N under close reefed
fore sail, fore sail & main sail Middle
part more moderate at 11 Am set all
sail latter part fine moderate
weather saw Nothing so ends the Day

Saturday November the 2nd

this day commenced with fine pleasant
weather the ship steering W by N with
all sail set Middle & latter part
fine clear weather still steering
W by N with all sail set saw
Nothing so ends this Day

Sunday November the 3rd

this day commenced with fine & pleasant
weather very clear steering W by N
I with all sail on Middle & latter
part very light wind, still steering
W by N & went to the Norfolk Island
saw Nothing so ends the Day

Monday November the 4th

this day commenced with very light
winds from the S the ship steering W
with all sail set went to the Norfolk
Island saw Nothing Middle part still
light weather at 7 Am went to
fore fore sail to repair the weather
very pleasant so ends this Day

of New Bedford in the Pacific Ocean looking for
Sperm Whales

Tuesday November the 5th 1867

this day commenced with pleasant weather
still the ship steering W by N we went
to the Norfolk Island at 2 pm finished
the fore sail & went it saw Nothing
at Daylight saw the land still
running fore the land so ends this Day

Wednesday November the 6th

First part commenced with very pleasant
weather steering fore the Island off at 11 pm
the Capt. lower the boat & went shore
still laying off on at 6 pm the boat came
on board at Daylight went the boat
on shore again so ends this Day

Thursday November the 7th

First part fine pleasant weather still
laying off on the boat still on shore
Middle & latter part light & pleasant
weather still laying off on so ends the
Day

Friday November the 8th

First part very light before the boat
still on shore at sunset the boat
came on board Middle & latter part
the same the boat still on shore
so ends the Day

Saturday November the 9th

First part light the island at sun
set the island still in sight & the
ship heading E by N at 1 pm were
ship to the S by W the island
still in sight so ends the Day
