

Remarks on board the Ship *James Arnold* of
Sunday November the 10th 1867

First part very pleasant the island
still in sight the ship heading S by E
in company with Milton at sunset the
weather very pleasant Middle & latter
part calm the Milton still in sight
& the island so ends the Day

Monday November the 11th

this day commenced with very light
wind from the North the island still
in sight & the Milton at sunset the is-
land out sight the Milton still in
sight the ship steering S by E
with all sail set Middle & latter part
fine light winds from N.W. saw nothing
so ends the Day

Tuesday November the 12th

this day commenced with fine pleasant
breeze from N.W. the ship steering
S by E with all sail set Middle
& latter part fine breeze from the W
the ship steering S by E saw nothing
so ends the Day

Wednesday November the 13th

First part fine pleasant weather the
ship still steering S by E with all
sail set at 3 pm took a squall took
in all light sails & at 4 pm double
reefed the top sail, at sunset having
rain the wind from the South Middle
part still light wind latter part
fresh wind took in all sail all but
double reefed top sails & fore sail saw
nothing so ends this Day

Now bedford in the Pacific ocean looking for
sperm Whales

Thursday November the 14th 1867

First part Moderate Gale the ship
under double reefed main top sail &
fore sail the wind from S.E. the ship
steering S by E latter part moderate
set all sail saw nothing so ends the
Day

Friday November the 15th

this day commenced with very light
wind from the S the ship heading
S by E at sunset still light & wind
& cloudy Middle & latter part the
same the ship heading S by E the wind
from the W S.W. at 8 am took a ship
to the S.W. the wind from the S.E. took
in fore top gallant sail so ends the
Day

Saturday November the 16th

First part fine pleasant breeze & calm
the ship heading S by E
at sunset the weather the same Middle
& latter part very light weather
saw finbacks so ends the Day

Sunday November the 17th

this day commenced with very light
weather the ship steering S by E the
wind from the North at sunset the
weather very pleasant Middle & latter
part fresh wind & very equal double reefed the
top sail, saw finbacks, so ends the
Day
