

Remarks on Board the Ship Flying Dutchman
Monday November the 25th 1867
the day commenced with fresh winds
the ship heading W by N at
8 pm were ship to the S E at
sunset the weather the same Middle
part strong winds latter part
heavy gale at 11 am took in the
main top sail still the ship head
ing S E so ends this Day

Tuesday November the 26th
this day commenced with a very heavy
gale at one pm took in fore top sail
sail very squally the ship still
heading S E at sunset set the main
top sail at 8 pm took down in again
middle & latter part still
fresh gale from the South so
ends this Day

Wednesday November the 27th
this day commenced with moderate
winds & light squalls at 10 am
heavy to land, set fore sail &
haul the reefed top sail, & still
the ship heading S by E at sunset
took in fore & main top sails &
steering by the wind middle
& latter strong winds some squalls
so ends the Day

Thursday November the 28th
this day commenced with fresh gale
from the W by N the ship heading S
by E under close reefed main top sail
& fore sail middle part fresh gale
latter part more moderate to new
squalls so ends this Day

Friday November the 29th 1867
this day commenced with light winds
from the South the ship heading W
with all sail on & very heavy sea on
at 4 pm the wind came from the W
more ship to the South at sunset
haul the reefed top sail, the ship
heading to the W by N steering by the
wind the W by N very pleasant
middle part strong winds & thick at
8 am took in the main top sail at
11 am set it again so ends the Day

Saturday November the 30th
this day commenced with fresh gale
from the North & very thick took
in fore sail & fore sail & close reefed
main top sail the ship heading to
the W by N at 5 pm set the
fore sail again & some were reefed out
the main top sail middle part fresh
gale at daylight set fore & main
top sails & main sail & still fresh
winds at 10 am took in the main sail
saw nothing so ends this Day
