

Remarks on Board the ship from a journal of
Saturday December the 7th 1867
this day commenced with very light
weather the ship heading S. with
all sail set & gave paylines at sunset
took in & reefed to the wind to the
S. E. middle part light & weather at Day
light set all sail employed
broke out water tank in the light
sails so ends the Day

Sunday December the 8th
the day commenced with fresh breeze
from the S. E. the ship heading S. E.
under bare top sail, & fore sail & file
at sunset took in the sail still
the ship heading S. E. middle part
more moderate at Daylight set all
sail latter part the weather the
same save a thing so ends this Day

Monday December the 9th
this day commenced with very pleas-
ant weather the ship still heading
to the S. E. gave for bark, at sunset
took in the ship to the North & took
in all sail all but double reefed
main top sail & fore sail fore top stay
sail & main top sail middle part
fresh breeze & thick at Daylight
set double reefed top sail, & main
sail & file still heading North
so ends this Day

New Bedford in the Pacific ocean leaving for
Spain W. H. Hall,
Tuesday December the 10th 1867
this day commenced with fresh breeze
& very thick weather the ship still
heading North under the same sail at
sunset double reefed the top sail, &
took in the main sail & file & middle
part fresh winds & thick at Daylight
set main sail & file at 6 A.M. set 2
sail, at 8 A.M. spoke one of the
sail the another still in sight so ends
the Day

Wednesday December the 11th
this day commenced with fresh
winds from the S. E. the 2 sails
still in sight at sunset took in
the fore & main top sails the ship
still heading to the North under
double reefed main top sail & fore
sail fore top stay sail & main top sail
middle part fresh winds & moderate
sail in sight & made on sail still head-
ing to the S. E. at 4 P.M. so ends this Day

Thursday December the 12th
this day commenced with fresh gales
from the S. E. the ship heading S. E.
the 2 sail in sight at one from
near ship to the S. E. at sunset were
ship to the N. E. at 4 P.M. the weather
the same middle & latter part still
fresh breeze & thick at 1 A.M. were
ship to North the wind from the
N. E. with some nothing so ends the
Day
