

Remark, on Board the ship *James Arnold*
Friday, December the 27th 1867
this day commenced with very pleasant
the ship steering N.E. with all sail on
at sunset took in all light sails &
hoisted up fore sail & blew down the top
sails middle part by light winds at
daylight set all sail & employed
on the ship duty saw nothing so
ends this day

Saturday, December the 28th
this day commenced with very light
weather the ship steering E.N.E. at
sunset took in all light sails & double
reefed the top sails middle part
the weather very light latter part
employed on the ship duty saw nothing
so ends this day

Sunday, December the 29th
this day commenced with very pleasant
weather the ship still steering E.N.E.
with all sail on at 6 pm saw a sail
to the South heading to the North at
sunset took in all light sails &
double reefed the top sails & luffed
to two the wind backing E middle
part calm at 4 am the Capt
of the Milton came on board so
ends the day

Monday, December the 30th
this day commenced with calm still
in company with Milton at 10 am
the Capt went on board Milton
& latter part still calm the
Milton still in sight so ends the
day

of New Bedford in the Pacific ocean looking
for sperm whales

Tuesday, December the 31st 1867
this day commenced with calm the
Milton still in sight saw many small
fish at sunset the Milton still in sight
& took a light breeze from the North the
ship steering E. with all sail on middle
& latter part the weather & but the
same saw porpoises & small fish so ends
this day

Wednesday, January the 1st 1868
this day commenced with very plea-
sant the ship steering E. with all
sail set saw porpoises & small fish
at sunset took in the light sails
& steering E.E. middle part the very
pleasant at daylight made all
sail & saw porpoises & small fish
still employed on the ship duty
so ends this day

Thursday, January the 2nd
this day commenced with very
pleasant weather the ship heading
E.N.E. with all sail on saw a sail
heading at sunset took in all light
sails & double reefed the top sails
& wore ship to the West heading
by the wind middle part fresh
breeze from the N.W. at daylight
took the reef out the top sail at
10 am double reefed the fore & main
top sails at 11 am double reefed
the main top sail & took in the
main sail & h'd so ends the
day
