

Remarks on Board the Ship James Arnold
Monday January the 27th 1868
First part fine pleasant weather the
ship heading S.E. by the wind with
all sail on the another ship out side
to the West at sunset took in all
light sail, & double reefed the top
sail, & set main top sail middle
part light weather at Daylight set
all sail at 8 am kept to off. The
mainsa still insight nothing
so ends this Day

Tuesday January the 28th
This Day commenced with very
light weather the another ship
still insight the 2 ships steering
West at sunset luffed to the the
wind heading of E. & took small
sail all but double reefed
main top sail & fore sail fore top
stay sail & set main top sail mid-
dle part the weather very pleasant
the ship heading of at Daylight set
all sail latter part the same case
of nothing so ends this Day

Wednesday January the 29th
This Day commenced with very pleas-
ant weather the ship still heading
South with all sail set at sunset
took in all light sail, & double reefed
the top sail, still heading South
by the winds middle part slight
squally & pleasant at Daylight set
main all sail & were ship to the
South at 7 am saw steam whaling
going to the East at 9 am saw all
boats so ends this Day

of New Bedford in the Pacific Ocean Cruising
for Sperm Whales
1868

Thursday January the 30th
First part commenced with very
pleasant weather from the fore
came on board with out surf the
ship heading E. & S.E. with all sail
on at sunset took ship to the
S.E. still with all sail on all
but fore top gallant sail & main
top stay sail the whaler going the
East & the wind from the East all
this 24 hours fine & pleasant save at bath-
ing so ends this Day

Friday January the 31st
This Day commenced with very fine
weather the ship heading S.W. by S.
with all sail on at sunset took
in all light sail, & double reefed
top sail, still heading S.E. by S.
by the winds middle part fresh
winds & heavy clouding at Daylight were
unrefined the main top sail & set main
sail & fore sail latter part still a fresh breeze
so ends this Day

Saturday February the First
This day commenced with strong winds
& squall the ship heading S.W. by E. still
blowing on took in the main sail at
4 pm took in the top at sunset took
took in the fore main top sail, & lay
two still blowing on the ship still
heading S.W. by E. middle part strong
winds latter part the same
so ends this Day
