

Remark, on Board the Ship James Arnold
 Thursday February the 27th 1868
 this day commenced with strong wind,
 & squalls from the S.W. set main
 top gallant sail & turn the reef, &
 out the main top sail at sunset
 double reefed the top sail & took
 in the main sail. main top gallant
 nil & flying jib the ship heading
 S by W middle part very light
 winds from the S.W. at day light set
 all sail at 8 am saw the land one of
 the New Zealand Island at 9 am took
 ship to the S.W. so ended the Day

Friday February the 28th
 this day commenced with very light
 breeze from the South the ship heading
 W. by N still the land in sight at
 sunset the ship heading W by S the
 wind from the S.E. hauled in to the
 Day, of the land

Say in front
 March
 Friday March the 27th
 this day commenced with strong
 wind, & very thick the ship heading
 S.E. under double reefed top sail,
 jib & fore sail & main sail at sun
 set the weather & but the same
 took in the jib & main sail still
 the weather very thick middle &
 part stormy gale & heavy rain so
 ended the Day

at New Bedford in the Pacific Ocean

On Saturday March the 28th
 this day commenced with strong wind
 & very thick weather the ship still
 heading S.E. the ship under double
 reefed top sail, middle & latter part
 the same so ended the Day

Sunday March the 29th

this day commenced with strong wind
 & rain & very thick at sunset took in
 fore & main top sail & fore sail & set
 fore stay sail still moderate gale,
 C.B.
