Monday, June the 1st 1868
Bond for the Sunday Island with
very light winds. Middle & latter
part the same at Daylight on bent
main sail to repairing & saw nothing
so ends the Day,

Tuesday, June the 2^d
this day commenced with very light
breeze from the S.W. the ship steering
N.E. at sunset took in the
light sail, still hoisted two
Sunday Island Middle & latter
part calm so ends the Day,

Wednesday, June the 3^d
this day commenced with very cloud
& light rain at 4 pm took in the
light sails & main sail at 5 pm
double reefed the top sail, still
raining the ship heading N. the wind
from the East Middle & latter part
light winds saw nothing so ends
the Day,

Thursday, June the 4th
this day commenced with light squall
at one pm saw the land the ship
steering E by S at sunset very
clear Middle & latter part squall
& strong winds from S.W. gate island
insight so ends the Day,

this day commenced with fresh breeze
& light squall the ship steering N.E.
at 2 pm saw the island Sunday Island
at 4 pm reefed two the wind to the

kept off & steering N.E. by W. & set
fore & main top sail, & turn the reefers
out the top sail, & set main sail
the island still insight so ends the
Day,

Saturday, June the 6th
this day commenced with fine pleas-
ant weather at 2 pm sent 2 boat,
in to fish at sunset came on board
& kept off N.E. with all sail set
Middle part light weather at Day-
light steering N. by E the island
still insight saw nothing so ends
the Day,

Sunday, June the 7th
this day commenced with light breeze
& squall the ship steering N. by E at
sunset took in all light sail, & main
sail the wind from the South still
squall Middle & latter part fine
weather still steering N. by E
so ends the Day,
