

Remarks on board the Ship James Enchelt of New
Saturday June the 20th 1868
at first part saw a sail of Ship & back
to the S. heading to the West at 4 pm
Spark the back at sunset took in the sail
& luffed to two the wind heading to the East
Middle part still light weather
at Daylight set in a sail & kept
off to the South the back still in sight
at 10 Am saw a white water the back
out side so ends this Day

Sunday June the 21st
this day commenced with fresh breeze
from the East the Ship steering South
& very cloudy at 3 pm saw a fine back
at sunset took in all light sail, still
steering South bound to Cook Island
Middle part fresh breeze latter part
still fresh wind, rain & very thick
cloud at 10 Am double reefed the top
sail, so ends the Day

Monday June the 22nd
this day commenced with fresh wind
& rain the Ship heading S by W
at 3 pm saw the Island Cook to the
S. W. at sunset wore Ship to the S. E.
under the double top sail, & for sail
Middle part fine pleasant weather
at 5 Am kept off S. W. the
Island of Cook at about 10 mile.
at 10 Am on board went on shore so
ends this Day

Berford in the Pacific Ocean looking for them
Tuesday June the 23rd 1868

at first part lay off on at Cook at
5 pm the boat, came on board & stood
off shore we got 12 fowls & 12 hundred off
Coconut, at Middle part double reefed
the top sails at 2 Am wore Ship in shore
at 8 Am the boat, went on shore again
so ends the Day

Wednesday June the 24th
this day commenced with very fine
weather the boat, still on shore at 4
pm the boat, came on board
& kept the Ship off South with
very fine wind, Middle part set all
light sails latter part the weather
the same at 10 Am saw a sail
to the South heading to the South so ends
this Day

Thursday June the 25th
this day commenced with very pleasant
weather the another sail still in sight the
Ship steering S. by W. the wind from the
S. E. at sunset the weather the same
Middle part steering South at
9 Am saw a sail to East so ends
the Day

Friday June the 26th
this day commenced with very pleas-
ant the another sail still in sight
still heading South sunset took in
the light sail, & double reefed the top
sails Middle part light still weather
at Daylight set all sail saw nothing
so ends this Day
