Saturday June the 27th 1868

this day commenced with very light winds,
the Ship steering by the wind heading S.E. 4/5
at sunset took in the light sail; the
weather very pleasant Middle & latter
part calm saw nothing so ends the Day,

Sunday June the 28th

this day commenced with very light weather
but very cloudy, the Ship heading N. East
saw small fish at sunset took in the
light sail, & double reefed the top sail,
& shifted to the wind N. heading
N. 4/5, the wind from the North
Middle part calm at Daylight heavy
rain latter part still raining saw
finback so ends this Day,

Monday June the 29th

this day commenced with light winds
& rain squally the wind from all quarters
the wind very light but heavy clouds
at sunset took in the same sail the
weather took in the same Middle
part fine pleasant weather at Daylight
set all sail, saw a finback, the
Ship steering S.E. so ends this Day,

Tuesday June the 30th

this day commenced with very pleasant
weather the Ship steering S.E. with all
sail set saw one finback at sunset
took in the light sails & double reefed
the top sail, still heading S.E. by the
wind Middle part the weather very plea-
sant at Daylight made all sail at 8 pm
on bent main gallant sail to repairing at 11
am finish & bent it so ends the Day,

for New Bedford in the Pacific Ocean looking
for Sperm Whales,

Wednesday July the First 1868

this day commenced with very pleasant weather
the Ship heading E. by N. with all sail on at
one pm on bent main gallant sail to repairing
at 3 pm finish it & bent it at sunset kept off
N. 4/5 still all sail out saw one finback
Middle & latter part very light weather
her. saw nothing so ends this Day,

Thursday July the 2nd

this day commenced with light from the
South the Ship steering N. by E. 4/5 at
3 pm saw a sail to the East it heading
to the West at 5 pm took a heavy
squally blow down the top sails &
double reefed it at sunset spoke the
Milton she got nothing Middle part
squally the Milton still in sight at Day
light we kept off N. 4/5 & set
all sail at 10 am the Milton still in
sight so ends ends the Day,

Friday July the 3rd

this day commenced with pleasant weather
the Ship still steering N. by E. 4/5 with
all sail on saw one finback at pm took
in the main sail standing see watches
Middle part very fine weather latter
part still the same at 5 & A.M. saw
the Island of Pigeon Point saw a fin-
back so ends the day,
