

Remarks in Board the ship James Arnold of
Thursday September the 3rd 1868

This day commenced with fresh winds & rain squalls,
we still in company with Milton the Capt. & all board
the Milton the weather still strong winds & very
squally. At sunset a bit the same middle & &
latter part the same so ends this day.

Friday September the 4th
all this 24 hours strong gales from the
South the ship Milton still in sight
so ends this day.

Saturday September the 5th
This day commenced with strong winds from
the South. At sunset the weather a bit
the same middle part moderate. At
daylight set all sail heading to the S. W.
At 8 A.M. was ship to the E. the ship
Milton still in sight. At 9 A.M. saw a
another sail to the North heading
to the South so ends this day.

Sunday September the 6th
This day commenced with very pleasant
weather the 2 sails out side the wind
from the S.E. At sunset took in all
light sails & double reefed the top sails
still heading the E. steering by the wind
middle & latter part calm saw one small
ack so ends this day.

At Bedford in the Pacific ocean cruising for
Shenn. W. Hole

Monday September the 7th 1868
This day commenced with very light winds
from the E & very cloudy. The ship head-
ing S. & E. At sunset took in the light
sails & double reefed the top sails & wore
ship to the North steering by the wind
middle & latter part strong winds & rain
from the N.E. so ends this day.

Tuesday September the 8th
This day commenced with strong winds &
heavy rain. At 4 P.M. took in the fore &
mizen top sails still leaving two under the
double reefed main top sail & fore sail & main-
ten sail & fore top stay sail middle part
still raining & strong winds. At day light
more moderate set double reefed top sail
& fore sail now one fin back the ship steering
by N. so ends this day.

Wednesday September the 9th
This day commenced with light winds from
the N.W. the ship steering E. by N. At sunset
took in the fore & mizen top sails
middle part light weather. At day
light set all sail the wind very light
from the N. saw porpoises so ends this
day.
