

Remarks on board the ship James Arnold
Saturday October the 10th

This day commenced with calm, still
employed bailing saws & pathing.
Middle part still bailing at
daylight finished bailing the Milton
insight 10 ends this day

Sunday October the 11th

This day commenced at with very light
winds & calm the Milton insight
at sunset the capt of the Milton
came on board & is wife middle part
fine pleasant weather at daylight still
in company with Milton saw a another sail
& saw several finbacks, so ends the day

Monday October the 12th

This day commenced with very fine pleas-
ant weather the ship steering to the
S.W. still in company with Milton
at sunset took in the light sails &
double reefed the top sail & steering
S.W. by E the wind is from S.E. middle
part the same at daylight the Milton
still insight commenced break out &
fore told store the oil at 9 am saw
more Whales at 10 am saw all the
boats at 11 am one the boats stuck
& got stove & another boat stuck
the Whales still insight
so ends this day

of New Bedford in the Pacific Ocean

Tuesday October the 13th 1868

at first part the boats still at
aft the Whales at 2 pm another
boat stuck at 5 pm took the whale
a long side & took in all sail at
sunset the weather very pleasant
middle part the same at 5 am
commenced bailing the Milton still
insight at 10 am finished bailing
so ends this day

Wednesday October the 14th

This day commenced with very fine
weather still employed bailing the
Milton still insight the ship heading
from W to S.W. at sunset the
wind is very light middle part
the same at daylight the Milton
still insight at 6 am the
Milton were ship to the east at
10 am the Milton out side saw
finbacks so ends the day

Thursday October the 15th

This day commenced with calm still
employed bailing at 8 pm finish
bailing middle part still calm
at daylight commenced repairing
stove boat saw porpoises still
employed on the boat so ends
this day
