

Remarks on board the ship James Arnold
Thursday October the 22th 1868

This day commenced with very light weather
the Milton still in sight the ship heading
from the S.E. to the N.E. At sunset took
in the light sails & double reefed the
top sails, the ship heading N.E. & under
double reefed top sail. Middle part
fresh breeze & foggy. At daylight were
ship to the West & set the jib the
Milton still in sight employed on the
ship's duty, saw nothing so ends this
day.

Friday October the 23rd

This day commenced with fresh breeze from
the South, the 2 ships heading to the
West the weather still very thick
& fresh breeze. At sunset took in
the jib & fore sail still heading to the
West by the wind under double
reefed top sails. Middle part a rain
squally. At daylight calm & light
rain, the Milton still in sight. At 8
A.M. kept off & steering N.E. & saw
nothing so ends this day.

Saturday October the 24th

This day commenced with very light
wind from the South the 2 ships steering
to the North. At sunset reefed to the
the wind heading East & took in the
light sails & double reefed the top
sails. Middle part light weather &
cloudy. At daylight light rain the
Milton still in sight. Set all sail
heading N.E. saw nothing so ends
this day.

Sunday October the 25th 1868

This day commenced with moderate winds
& light rain the Milton still in sight
& saw another sail to the South steering
to the N.E. At sunset heavy rain took
in all sail all but double reefed top
sail, still raining. Middle part squally
rain still heavy & cloudy. At daylight
set all sail & still heavy squally to the
N.W. the Milton out sight at 11 A.M.
saw the Milton again to the S.E. so ends
this day.

Monday October the 26th

This day commenced with very pleasant
weather the 2 ships heading to the N.W.
with the wind from the S.E. At sunset
took in the light sails & double reefed
the top sail, & tackeed to the N.E. Middle
part fine weather. At daylight set
all sail & kept off & steered N.W.
by N. the Milton still in sight
saw nothing so ends this day.

Tuesday October the 27th

This day commenced with very pleasant
weather. At 2 p.m. the 2 ships steering
West. At sunset took in all sail
all but double reefed top sail.
Middle part still light winds & heavy
cloudy. At daylight set all sail & steering
N.W. by N. the Milton still in sight
saw nothing so ends the day.
