Sunday November the 15<sup>th</sup> 1868

This day commenced with strong wind from  
the S.W. still laying off on still the  
boat on shore At sunset the boat  
came on board middle part still the  
same weather At daylight the wind  
from the S.W. so ends this day

Monday November the 16<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with fresh breeze from  
the S.W. the 2 ships still laying off  
on At. Norfolk island At sunset the  
weather more moderate middle part  
weather a boat the same At daylight  
more moderate sent one boat on  
shore latter part the same the  
boat still on shore so ends this day

Tuesday November the 17<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with fine weather  
the boat still on shore At sunset  
came on board the bark North light  
insight the weather more moderate  
middle part still moderate  
weather the 2 ships & the bark  
still laying off on At daylight  
sent 2 boats on shore so ends this  
day

Wednesday November the 18<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with fine pleasant  
weather At 2 pm the Capt  
came on board & the wife & Stadesent  
heading E by S middle & latter part  
still fine weather the Milton still  
insight & so ends this day

Thursday November the 19<sup>th</sup> 1868

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather  
the 2 ships heading from E to S by E  
At sunset took in the light sails &  
double reefed the topsails steering by  
the wind At 9 pm were ship to the  
South middle part still fine weather  
At daylight set all sail the Milton  
still insight At 8 am on line on main  
top sail & bent a another the ship  
Milton out side so ends the day

Friday November the 20<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with very  
pleasant weather the ship steering S by E  
with all sail set commenced on the main  
top sail At 4 pm saw a another sail to  
the S by steering to the S.W. At sunset  
took in all light sails still steering S by  
E under the hale top sails middle part  
fresh breeze & light rain squalls At daylight  
double reefed the top sail still steering  
S by E saw nothing so ends this day

Saturday November the 21<sup>st</sup>

This day commenced with very light  
weather still steering S by E employed in  
on the ship duty At one pm set fore & main  
sail At sunset calm took in the main  
sail middle part light winds At  
daylight trim the reefs, out the fore  
& main top sail & commenced repairing  
the hale main top sail so ends this  
day
