This day commenced with moderate
the ship heading S.E. At
sunset were ship to the North & took
in the fore & mizen to take sail & file
middle part still moderate At
daylight set all sail At 12 saw a
Whale of sperm Whales so ends this
day

Wednesday January the 20th
the Whales still in sight At one pm
lower all boats & stuck tow Whales &
took there a long side & commenced
cutting in the weather very pleasant
latter part still employed cutting
so ends this day

Thursday January the 21st
This day commenced with very
fine pleasant weather still employed
cutting At sunset finished cutting
& commenced hauling the wind very
light the ship heading to the S.W.
middle part calm latter part the
same so ends this day

Friday January the 22nd
This day commenced with the
very fine weather still employed
cutting so ends this day

Saturday January the 23rd
At this 24 hours very moderate
weather still employed hauling
so ends this day

New Bedford in the south Pacific ocean looking
fore sperm Whales

Sunday January the 24th
This day commenced with very
fine weather still employed hauling
all this 24 hours very fine weather
so ends this day

Monday January the 25th
This day commenced with fine
pleasant weather still employed
hauling At 11 pm finished hauling
middle part still fine weather
At daylight commenced hauling latter
part still fine weather saw nothing
so ends the day

Tuesday January the 26th
This day commenced with fine
light weather At 4 pm finished hauling
middle part still fine weather At
daylight commenced backing out to
stow oil latter part still fine weather
still employed stow oil so ends this
day

Wednesday January the 27th
This day commenced with
moderate weather still employed stow
oil middle part still moderate At
daylight finished stowing the oil
stow one hundred & 60 latter part fresh
breeze so ends this day

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
