

Remark on Board the Bark Ocean Steer. in the
Russell master Bbl

Tuesday, August the 23rd 1840 This day commenced with very heavy squally saw a sail to the N.E. at 6 pm spoke the ship Commodore Morris with ~~two~~ ^{one} hundred & 50 Bbls of sperm oil the 21 days from Flores at sunset took in light sails the ship heading W by S middle part heavy cloudy at day light the Commodore Morris still in sight the ship kept off & steerid South at 3 pm saw another sail to the W steering to the S latter part fine pleasant weather so ends this day Lat 41° 09' N Long 45° 54' W

Wednesday August the 24th 1840 This day commenced with fresh breeze from S.W. we still steerid South & the Commodore Morris at 3 pm saw another sail to the W steering to the E at 5 pm Capt Russell went on board the Commodore Morris at 7 pm came on board & short sail middle part strong winds & very heavy rain squally at day light saw 3 sails bound to the E set main sail & full bowing strong gale from S.W. so ends this day Lat 40° 11' N Long 45° 48' W

Broke out cask of bread & hundred & 40 galls
& one Bbl of Beef

Thursday August the 25th 1840 This day commenced with very strong winds from S.W. the ship heading S.E. took in main sail & full at sunset the weather a bout the same middle part light weather at day light calm set all sail all boat fore top gallant sail & full top sail the ship steerid S.E. saw nothing so ends this day Lat 40° 9'

Friday at August the 26th 1840 First part of day commenced with very light weather at sundown weather a bout the same the ship still steering S.E. with all sail in middle & latter part calm & light breeze saw one sail so ends at this day Lat 40° 15' N Long 42° W

Saturday August the 27th 1840 This day commenced with calm & light breeze from S.W. the ship heading S.E. At sundown calm the ship still with all sail with middle & latter part fine pleasant weather & sail in sight so ends this day Lat 40° 14' N

Sunday August the 28th 1840 This day still commenced with very pleasant weather the ship heading S.E. At one pm spoke the Bark John Dawson with nothing Capt went on board & came on board at 7 pm & stood long by the wind heading the same took in light sails middle part fresh winds from S.W. the ship heading S.W. latter part rain the wind from S.E. the ship heading S.W. by N so ends this day

Monday

Monday August the 29th 1840 This day commenced with strong winds from the N.N.E. the ship steering W. middle & latter part the noble 2 sail in sight so ends this day

Tuesday August the 30th 1840 Very part fine pleasant weather the ship steering N.W. so ends this day

Wednesday August the 31st 1840 First all the day have fine pleasant weather steering North nothing in sight
